

Dr. Robert E. Beckley

is Professor of Sociology and Program Director for Sociology at West Texas A&M University in Canyon. Beckley has authored four books and more than eighty articles, book reviews, and scholarly papers. He served as organist at the First Presbyterian Church of Canyon from 1975 through 2002. Dr. Beckley has also been organist for almost all of the WTAMU commencements since 1979. He was a member of the Amarillo Symphony Board of Directors from 1997 through 2004. He serves as treasurer and board

member of Friends of the Aeolian-Skinner Opus 24, a non-profit organization which is in charge of concerts featuring the famous organ at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Amarillo. He is married to Cheryl Beckley, who is a retired Tascosa High School teacher. Both are active members of Canyon's First Presbyterian Church, where he is an ordained elder. He has served as supply preacher on numerous occasions for First Presbyterian Church in Canyon as well as for other Presbyterian Churches in the area. The Beckley's were parents of one son, the late Brian Beckley.

Our Rodgers "American Classic" organ was originally installed in St. Paul's Methodist Church, Amarillo, in 1972. It was later purchased by Asbury Methodist, Lubbock, and given in memory of loved ones by Mr. Paul and the late Mrs. Mae Bush.
